The New Jersey Division on Civil Rights (DCR) Strategic Initiatives and Enforcement Unit seeks one (1) highly motivated law student with a passion for protecting civil rights to participate in its summer internship program. DCR is the division in the New Jersey Attorney General's Office that is responsible for combating discrimination in New Jersey. DCR's Strategic Initiatives and Enforcement Unit has a team of attorneys and a policy advisor who draft statutory amendments and regulations, issue reports to raise the profile of civil rights issues, draft legal guidance documents, and undertake Director-Initiated Investigations into possible patterns and practices of discrimination.

The summer intern will work closely with Legal Specialists within DCR's Strategic Initiatives and Enforcement Unit who focus on proactively addressing **discrimination in schools, police departments, and other places of public accommodation**. While the intern will primarily focus on discrimination in places of public accommodation, the intern may also have opportunities to work on other civil rights issues.

Preference will be given to students with a commitment to public service, and an interest in the intersectional nature of discrimination. In the cover letter, please indicate your interest in these areas. Please also indicate whether you plan to receive credit for the internship or whether you are receiving funding from your law school or applying for a grant or other funding source. Please note that you must complete a Confidential Background Investigation Clearance Form if you intend to accept an offer for a position in the externship program.

The internship position will be virtual, with an option of working in-person at any of DCR's four (4) offices. We encourage all interested students, including those who may not be able to join us physically, to apply.

Applications are due by March 10, 2023 and will not be reviewed prior to that date.
