New Jersey Firearms Law Update

Program Summary

This program will provide an overview and update of New Jersey firearms law. The presenter will discuss crimes involving firearms and the criminal consequences of firearms convictions, with an emphasis on the Graves Act. He will also provide firearms legislation updates and discuss some recent case studies.

Eligibility

This program is open to County Prosecutors and Assistant Prosecutors, Assistant and Deputy Attorneys General in the Department of Law and Public Safety's Division of Criminal Justice, and law enforcement officers in their respective offices.

Faculty

Jerome Neidhardt is a Special Deputy Attorney General/Acting Supervising Assistant Prosecutor in the Sussex County Prosecutor's Office. He is assigned to the Sussex County Guns, Gangs and Narcotics Task Force, where he prosecutes drug distribution and firearms cases. SDAG/ASAP Neidhardt has litigated numerous cases to trial, prosecuted juvenile cases, sex crimes and grand jury cases and second chaired a homicide trial. He was in private practice for two years before joining the Sussex County Prosecutor's Office. Prior to law school, SDAG/ASAP Neidhardt worked in the water and sewage pump distribution field, and might be the only licensed attorney in New Jersey who is also a licensed well pump installer. SDAG/ASAP Neidhardt clerked for the Hon. N. Peter Conforti, J.S.C., in Sussex County. He holds a B.A. in History, *summa cum laude*, from Nyack College and a J.D., *cum laude*, from Seton Hall University School of Law.
