<u>DUTIES</u>: We are seeking a highly organized and detail-oriented supervisor to oversee the Classification and Recruitment Unit under the supervision of the Manager 1, Human Resources. This position will be responsible for ensuring compliance with all classification, recruitment and employment regulations, ensuring adherence to eligibility requirements for all appointments, reviewing salary calculations, processing promotional and open competitive announcements, and reviewing job postings to ensure compliance. REQUIREMENTS

<u>NOTE</u>: Applicants must meet one of the following or a combination of both experience and education. Thirty (30) semester hour credits are equal to one (1) year of relevant experience.

Eight (8) years of professional experience in the personnel program of a public or private organization.

OR

Possession of a bachelor's degree from an accredited college or university; and four (4) years of the above-mentioned professional experience.

OR

Possession of a master's degree in business administration, personnel administration, public administration, management, or other related field; and three (3) years of the above-mentioned professional experience.

<u>NOTE</u>: "Professional experience" refers to work that is creative, analytical, evaluative, and interpretive; requires a range and depth of specialized knowledge of the profession's principles, concepts, theories, and practices; and is performed with the authority to act according to one's own judgment and make accurate and informed decisions.

LICENSE: Appointee will be required to possess a driver's license valid in New Jersey only if the operation of a vehicle, rather than employee mobility, is necessary to perform the essential duties of the position.

<u>RESUME NOTE</u>: Eligibility determinations will be based upon information presented in resume only. Applicants who possess foreign degrees (degrees earned outside of the U.S.) are required to provide an evaluation indicating the U.S. equivalency prior to the closing date. Failure to do so may result in your ineligibility.

This position may be eligible to telework for up to two (2) days a week as part of the YJC's Pilot Telework Program as authorized by the Civil Service Commission (CSC).

All offers of employment are conditional; subject to the applicant agreeing to, and then passing, a background check that may include fingerprinting.
